ONLY 48% OF YOUTH LIVING WITH HIV IN THE U.S. ARE VIRALLY SUPPRESSED The lowest percentage among all age groups. Someone who is virally suppressed has an almost zero risk of transmitting the virus to another person.



Ways to reduce the risk of HIV transmission:

Learn about PrEP & PEP! PrEP - a daily pill for people who do not have HIV to help them stay negative.

BLACK YOUTH ARE DISPROPORTIONATELY AFFECTED BY THE HIV EPIDEMIC.

Only 32% of Louisiana's population is Black...

BUT 88% of new HIV infections among youth are Black

79% are gay, bisexual men, and transwomen who have sex with men

36% of new HIV diagnoses among TRANSGENDER WOMEN in Louisiana were TRANS YOUTH OOO

Only 52% of Louisiana youth living with HIV are virally suppressed
